




Common Objectives & Principles







1. Policies and Processes





Collaboration in Progress

In Progress - Cybersecurity

Top of mind for us all:

- The Cybersecurity and Identity Management Services Committee (CSIMSC) provides advice, makes recommendations, and identifies common needs
- BCNET's Cybersecurity Working Group stays abreast of national and international opportunities, raises awareness across sector community
- Looking to continue to build bridges for potential efficiencies within and externally to our sector/province

Key Action Items:

- Promote sector participation in provincially and federally funded initiatives and monitor and share information on services adoption.
- Invest strategically in sector-wide cybersecurity initiatives.





In Progress - Enterprise Resource Planning

Issue:

- ERP procurements are complex and significant investments
- Some institutions have moved or are moving to the cloud, other institutions continue to maintain server-based systems

Key Action Items:

• Finding points of collaboration – as an example, several institutions that utilize the Ellucian Colleague ERP system have formed a Colleague Service Committee, the ministry is working with this group to optimize investment and service delivery
